




2003 - a bare dirt lot And just several years later - a thriving community garden





OAK PARK COMMUNITY GARDEN. In 2003, a group called the Oak Park Gardeners got together with the purpose of establishing an organic community garden where individual members can grow vegetables or flowers of their choice. They brought life to a vacant dirt lot at the corner of Kanan Road and Sunnycrest Drive. Near this spot in the 1960s was a trailer where early Oak Park site manager Dan Lavetts (Mae Boyar's nephew) watched over the houses before they were sold. (Greg Tucker.)


Oak Park blossomed Saturday, May 1, with the dedication of its new community garden. An estimated 125 visitors joined with members of Oak Park Gardeners Club, Rancho Simi Recreation and Parks District President Mark Johnson, Ventura County Supervisor Linda Parks, RSRPD Boardmember Elaine Freeman and Oak Park Community Foundation President David Ross at the gardens, at the corner of Kanan Road and Sunnycrest Drive.

- Metal Shipping Container for Tool Storage




OPCG Improvements Through the Years

- Information kiosk built by a local Eagle Scout
- Pollinator garden created in one of the available parcels
- Seed library created by a local OPHS student
- RSRPD granted permission for gardeners to cover parcels
- Parcel chats initiated for gardeners educational talks led by experts
- Lowes donated materials for garden bed to be built under the sign on the corner of Sunnycrest
- Raptor perch installed
- Monarch Waystation planted and certified in back corner of the garden
- Member created cookbook published
- Monarch Waystation expanded and rebuilt
- Greenhouse erected next to the Kanan side of the garden for seed starting
- \$10,000 grant received from Harbor Freight's "Smidt Foundation" to build shade structures/pavilions at the garden














With elbow grease and teamwork, the Monarch Waystation became an oasis in the Garden

 - > Inclusion of OPCG in various OPUSD events and garden work days


