RE: March 2026 MAC Law Enforcement Report

This report covers the period of January 27th, 2026 (date of last report) through March 18th, 2026. During this time period deputies working in the Oak Park Community responded to 210 calls for service. This was an increase of 49 more calls for service than during the same time period in 2024/2025. Deputies also made nine self-initiated contacts. There were 37 reports taken. 18 of the reports were crime reports and 19 were incident reports.

NOTE: Incident reports are generated from calls for service where deputies were unable to establish a crime but documented the incident. Those incidents were reviewed by detectives to see if any further follow-up was required.

Summary of Crimes Documented:

RESIDENTIAL BURGLARY

26-29853 – 6425 Trefoil Ave

Suspects cut the power to the residence and forced entry into the residence by way of a back door. Cash and other valuables were taken. Video in the area showed two hooded subjects exit a vehicle and approach the house on foot shortly after the residents left the location.

THEFT

26-13940 – CVS - 632 Lindero Canyon Rd

ORT INCIDENT – Two Suspects entered the store and selected approximately \$1500 in cosmetics. The suspect exited the store without paying and left the area in a Toyota Van.

26-18722 – CVS – 632 Lindero Canyon Rd

ORT INCIDENT – Two Suspects entered the store and selected approximately \$2100 in cosmetics. The suspect exited the store without paying and left the area in a light-colored sedan.

26-28715 – 1000 Block of Doubletree Road

Real estate sign stolen

26-32966 – Kanan Rd / Deerhill Rd

The victim placed his backpack down at a bus stop and sat down away from the backpack. When the victim returned, a laptop had been stolen from inside the backpack

OTHER CRIMES

Tennis courts were vandalized with graffiti.
